


ALBERTA'S FOUR MAJOR CROP COMMISSIONS COLLABORATE TO PRODUCE THE BLUE BOOK

Alberta's crop protection guide, also known as the Blue Book, has provided farmers and agronomists with valuable pesticide product information for more than 20 years. The Alberta Wheat Commission (AWC), Alberta Barley, Alberta Canola Producers Commission and Alberta Pulse Growers Commission will now co-operate to produce the annual Blue Book. The four commissions will work together to ensure the guide continues to deliver valuable crop protection information to Alberta farmers, agronomists and agriculture professionals.

Expect print and digital versions of the 2021 Blue Book to be available in March 2021. 
